Acinetobacter baumannii (*A. baumannii*), strain 1109222 was isolated in 2014 from a blood sample of a 37-year-old male in Colombia. It was deposited as resistant to amikacin, cefepime, ceftazidime, ceftriaxone, ciprofloxacin, doripenem, imipenem, levofloxacin, meropenem, piperacillin/ tazobactam and tetracycline. NR-56703 was produced by inoculation of the deposited material into Tryptic Soy broth and grown for 1 day at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere. The material from the initial growth was passaged in Tryptic Soy broth for 1 day at 37°C in an aerobic atmosphere to produce this lot. Quality control testing was completed under propagation conditions unless otherwise noted.
